NOTICE IS GIVEN that the Commission will hold a technical conference on October 22, 2009, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the Flambeau River Room on the third floor of the Public Service Commission Building, 610 North Whitney Way, Madison, Wisconsin. Public comments were submitted and reviewed in two phases, the first following the Notice of Investigation into Advanced Renewable Tariffs (ART) and the second following the Commission's Briefing Memorandum. The principal purpose of this technical conference is to allow certain Wisconsin utilities and their representative organizations to make oral presentations to the Commissioners, explaining their progress on creating voluntary ARTs that integrate key policy elements to encourage small-scale distributed generation in Wisconsin. The conference is intended to facilitate the development of a best practices model for implementing voluntary ARTs that are, to the extent practicable, uniform across the state. Each utility and organization is limited to 10 to 15 minutes to present its plans, and Commissioners will subsequently have time to ask questions. Utilities and organizations may consolidate their time to make a joint presentation. All presentations may last no more than 75 minutes total, and the utilities and organizations shall inform the docket coordinator listed below how they have allotted their presentation time. The utilities and organizations shall inform the docket coordinator in writing about their allotment of time no later than Monday, October 19, 2009, at 4:00 p.m.
