In February 2015 at the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners Winter Committee Meetings, the Electric Power Research Institute launched “The Integrated Grid Benefit-Cost Framework,” which describes a benefit-cost methodology to define the tools, protocols, and methods necessary to conduct consistent, repeatable, and transparent studies to anticipate and accommodate distributed energy resources. The Framework is rooted in the fundamentals of power system engineering and economics, making the methods applicable to all regions, systems, markets, technologies, and research questions. By using a common evaluation methodology, utilities and other stakeholders can compare and contrast studies and articulate their findings in ways that make the results understandable and applicable to others.

A public briefing on the Framework is scheduled featuring Ben York, Engineer/Scientist III; and Barbara Tyran, Director, Washington & State Relations.
